- FloridaRAMA is comprised of interactive, immersive art exhibits. There are bright neon lights, music, sound effects, wind and scent experiences. As such, it is a high-sensory environment. Please plan accordingly if your loved one has sensory aversions.

- No outside food or drink is permitted in the exhibit space. However, there is a small café with snacks and drinks available for purchase. There is also a picnic patio outside at the South Entrance.







Arrival and Parking

When I arrive at FloridaRAMA, I can find free and accessible parking right outside the building.

There are 2 entrances and 2 parking lots to choose from.









Checking In

At the front desk, I can check in if I bought my tickets online or I can buy them in person when I arrive. I can request a sensory guide that highlights areas with lights, sounds, or interactive features. If I need noise-canceling headphones or fidget tools, they're available.



We can walk around on our own, or we might decide to play a game! The games are like scavenger hunts-

we will look for clues as we move through the exhibit, in order to solve a puzzle!

Check In

Before entering the exhibit space, we will stop here to watch a short video about what we will see and do.





Helpful Staff

If I get lost, have questions, or need a break, I can find a worker at FloridaRAMA to ask for help.

I will look for someone wearing a pink vests.



Exploring at My Own Pace

Inside the immersive art experience, I can wander through 20 different spaces at my own speed. First I will take this ramp to the main exhibit space. The exhibit space is mostly dark, with low and colorful lighting. I will also hear music in the background.

Engaging My Senses

While exploring I can gently touch the art, and in some rooms I can smell scents! Along my journey I'll discover artwork from over 75 artists! Every room dives into what makes Florida Weird, Wacky and Wonderful!





Some spaces can be smaller and I will patiently wait my turn to explore if someone else is there first.

Interaction & Activation

Here I can add my own tape to the wall. Maybe I will write my name or make a cool design!





Flashing Lights and Strobes



In the center of the exhibit space is an open area where the ceiling looks like a storm cloud. There will be brief lightning and thunder effects during the "hurricane activation"

This means a group of gamers have solved their puzzle!



This exhibit is called "The Bait Ball"

The fish were made with a 3D printer! This exhibit can be overwhelming because there is a strobe light effect, and the fish "swim" very fast. The exhibit is on a timer, so if I do not like the strobe light, I can wait a few minutes. Soon, it will stop and then I can pass through this area.

Headphone Zones

This is "CENTCOM" the Central Command Center.

This is a headphone zone. There are many interactive buttons, beeping and other loud sound effects.






Concessions & Snacks
